He has edited over twenty books himself, including <u>Communication with Extraterrestrial Intelligence (CETI)</u> (2011), <u>Feminist Ecocriticism</u> (2012), <u>Archaeology, Anthropology, and Interstellar Communication</u> (2014), <u>Ecopsychology, Phenomenology, and the Environment</u> (2014), <u>The Drake Equation</u> (2015), <u>Transecology: Transgender Perspectives on Environment and Nature</u> (2020), <u>Ecofeminist Science Fiction</u> (2021), <u>Transgender India</u> (2022), and <u>The Routledge Handbook of Ecofeminism and Literature</u> (2022). Vakoch is <u>President of METI International</u>, a San Francisco-based research organization whose namesake activity is Messaging Extraterrestrial Intelligence (METI)—sending powerful, intentional radio signals to nearby stars to elicit a response from possible technological civilizations. He is also <u>Director of Green Psychotherapy</u>, <u>PC</u>, a private practice that helps clients with eco-anxiety.
