He is also <u>Director of Green Psychotherapy</u>, PC, a private practice that helps clients with eco-anxiety, and he serves as general editor of two book series that include works in critical animal studies and plant studies: <u>Ecocritical Theory and Practice</u> and <u>Environment and Society</u>. Vakoch has edited twenty books himself, including <u>Communication with Extraterrestrial Intelligence (CETI)</u> (2011), <u>Feminist Ecocriticism</u> (2012), <u>Archaeology</u>, <u>Anthropology</u>, <u>and Interstellar Communication</u> (2014), <u>Extraterrestrial Altruism</u> (2014), <u>Ecopsychology</u>, <u>Phenomenology</u>, <u>and the Environment</u> (2014), <u>The Drake Equation</u> (2015), <u>Literature and Ecofeminism</u> (2018), <u>Transecology: Transgender Perspectives on Environment and Nature</u> (2020), and <u>Ecofeminist Science Fiction</u> (2021). His work has been featured in such publications as *The New York Times*, Nature, and Science.
